**Fact:** Recycling saves on our tax dollars.



Due to recent changes in the recycling world, we (Plymouth) will no longer have Thursday road side pick-ups. Starting April 1st Residents will be able to take their recycling to the Newport Transfer Station. Residents can get a recycling permit for \$5.00 from Adam Noyes at the Transfer Station. This is the same amount Newport Residents pay for their permits.

All containers must be **Rinsed** and **Without Covers!**

## What to Recycle!

**Plastics - Number 2 only Rinsed without covers.** You can find the number on the bottom of the container. We **do not** accept 5-gallon buckets, but we do take the 2 1/2 gallon kitty litter containers **without covers.**

**Newspapers, cardboard** (broken down) and **magazines.**

**Tin** - rinse out.

**Mixed Paper** - cereal boxes, junk mail, paper bags, etc.

## THE VETERAN'S COMMITTEE

As of December 31, 2018, between donations and our fundraising efforts, so far we have raised \$7,330.00.

## SALT SHED MEETING

On January 25th, the select board, office staff and the Road Commissioner, Doug Colson, met with Peter Coughlin from Maine DOT Community Services Division to get updates on Salt and Sand Buildings. Mr. Coughlin shared that there were no more funds available to assist the town with this project. He did share reports from other local towns on Engineers, Contractors and cost since 1990. Peter also pointed out that any public facility over \$100,000 must be engineered per state law. Along with site testing and core samples, we need to make sure the property is compression tested, as one of our first steps. After this meeting Doug Colson went over the local road inventory map to review all our public roads and 911.

The meeting was very educational and worth the time as we look forward towards a future salt shed.
